

# What is Posterior Capsule Opacification?

After cataract surgery, the back membrane of the cataract is left in place to support the lens implant. In some cases, this membrane can become cloudy, causing blurred vision.

This is called posterior capsule opacification, or PCO.

## Good news!

This can be treated with a very simple outpatient procedure called a YAG Laser Posterior Capsulotomy, or YAG for short.

#### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

During your procedure, you will be given numbing eye drops. Then, Dr. Solomon will use the YAG Laser to create an opening in the clouded back lining of the lens capsule, allowing light to pass through to the retina and providing you with clear vision once again.

The procedure <u>does not</u> involve any incisions, and no general anesthesia is needed. In fact, the entire procedure takes about 5 minutes, and most patients are able to resume their normal activities immediately after the procedure.

### **HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?**

YAG is covered by Medicare and most private insurances. Copay and deductible may apply.

#### POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- You may resume your normal activities immediately after the laser procedure.
- You will not need any eye patch, but do wear your glasses or sunglasses.
- Continue all of your normal medications by mouth and your regular drops (if any) after the laser procedure.
- Take Tylenol as needed for mild discomfort.
- After your laser procedure, you may experience any of the following; redness, slight blurring of vision, minimal discomfort in the eye and floaters.
   These are normal and usually last less than 72 hours.
- If you experience any of the following symptoms, please call our office immediately.
  - Severe pain
  - Sudden decrease in vision
  - Flashes of light
